Tattoos!!!!



Don't be blinded by the works and marks of Satan.

The Arabic and Egyptians use these markings by the form of submissiveness

Paganism. Tattoos on bodies, the earliest known examples were on Egyptian female mummies right hands dated to c. 2000 B.C as a form of submission.

Erecting a Temple to another 'god' within the Temple of YHVH. You Shall Reverence My Sanctuary.

The Scripture makes it clear that YHVH doesn't approve of these things. So we as children of Him should respect and honour our heavenly Father and also teach our children well.

Tattooing Has Witchcraft “Roots”. Baal worshipping is clear in the Scripture.

In pagan cultures, tattoo began as a form of demon worship. The letting of blood and body modification have always been associated with pagan worship and witchcraft. Pagans too know there is power in the blood. The root of tattooing never changes; it is, and always has been, a pagan spiritual activity.

1 Kings 18:28

And they cried aloud, and cut themselves after their manner with knives and lancets, till the blood gushed out upon them.

The word for “mark” in Revelation 13:16-17 comes from the word “charagma” (khar’-ag-mah); a scratching or etching, stamp (as a badge of servitude), or a sculptured figure (statue): graven, mark.

People do not realise displaying a mark or symbol can open the door for Satanic attack which allows the enemy entrance in their lives. It is not the mark itself, but rather the sin behind it that leads to the root of all evil.

YHVH made us to be without having to create a different image. We should not be consumed with trying to be different or become acceptable to people or be part of a fit in crowd. We are already His people.

Hosea 4:6 reads, “My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge.”

"I am YHVH your Elohim, who has separated you from the peoples"

I see the body as sacred, b'tzelem Elohim (in the image of Elohim), and any alteration should not be taken lightly. Marking the body is about marking ourselves for the DEAD!

When tattoos are put on the body it is an appearance for physical intimacy and you are dishonoring YHVH your Elohim

"You shall not make any cuttings in your flesh for the dead, nor tattoo any marks on you. I am YHVH." Leviticus 19:28

We should not require an outward sign to decorate our life. We are already a living proof with the markings of "His love" and our commitment should be to Him as the markings of His saving Grace in our life.

"Hear the word which YHVH your Elohim speaks to you, house of Yisra'el! Thus says YHVH, "Don't learn the way of the nations..."

Nations as pagan believers would not care to cut their bodies or mark them.

Nazis used the tattoo to strip the people of their humanity, destroy their dignity, humiliate their identity.

I think people would see less of who you really are and more of what you appear to be as signified by what's printed on you. When you don't have anything marking your flesh, your life is more open to interpretation and engagement.

The practice of tattooing is a pagan custom and should at the very least be avoided under the admonition Jeremiah. 10:1-2.

Leviticus 20:3 And I will set My face against that man, and will cut him off from among his people.

Satan is attempting to mark as many people as he can through these means. Perhaps on the day of judgment the accuser of the brethren, the devil, will stand before Elohim and try to claim those so marked as his own.

Elohim wants us to “come out from among them” 2 Corinthians. 6:17. To be a set aside people for Him.

Let me make it clear that there is absolutely no such thing as a Christian tattoo.

Hosea 2:19-20 discusses how Elohim betroth us to Himself, after we an unfaithful people, have chosen many other paths.

But Elohim forgives us and brings us back to Him, betrothing us in love, compassion, righteousness, justice, and faithful.

The Scriotures clearly tells us: “Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from Elohim, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify Elohim in your body” 1 Cor. 6:19-20.

Yeshua paid the price and we see His suffering on the cross and pain He endured for our sins.

Isaiah 53:5

But he was pierced for our transgressions. He was crushed for our iniquities. The punishment that brought our peace was on him; and by his wounds we are healed.
