

Noach Obedience - Repentance - Forgiveness

We learn from Biblical History the Merciful Salvation of YHVH. As we rediscover the importance of His purpose for all mankind, we also find our blessings in keeping His covenant by unity, through obedience. Through repentance come forgiveness and leading us to live a Holy life.

We have a far better understanding when we consider to remain committed to the oracles of YHVH. While we are covering the history of Genesis and get a better understanding, our faith and knowledge about who YHVH is increases.

Firstly it is that we understand this has to do with YHVH's Sovereign plan to bring righteousness to man.

As Abel got killed because of his righteousness, it is satan's plan to destroy all that connects the Oracles of YHVH.

Hebrews 11:4

By faith Abel offered to YHVH a better sacrifice than Qayin did, and by faith he was declared to be righteous, since YHVH himself accepted his offerings. And by faith he continues to speak, even though he is dead.

Righteousness is being morally correct, justifiable and synonymous in right relationship with YHVH with imputed obedience.

Being ignorant of the true word and purpose of YHVH's law is the same as if one establish themselves as righteous by their own merit only. Evil can be described in many forms. One of the ways of evil is, if there is refusal to submit to the One and only way YHVH has determined that a man might be righteous before Him.

James 4:7

So submit to [the authority of] YHVH. Resist the devil [stand firm against him] and he will flee from you.

This is to take dominion and not allow yourselves to fall under the lies of evil. Stand strong in faith and believe in the only One that is the truth and the way. Walk in righteousness.

It is clear that Chavvah (Eve) did not walk in the garden because she was looking for something to eat. Her hunger was to 'Acquired knowledge'. Spiritual knowledge is "know the truth". Accept YHVH's word for what He says is true. He is not man that He should lie.

Genesis 6:9

"This is the account of Noach and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with YHVH."

Let us take a moment and look at righteousness. Especially YHVH'S Righteousness

Romans 3:1-8

So then what is the importance of circumcision, and what advantage is there of being a Jew?

Actually, there are numerous advantages. Most important, God *distinguished the Jews from all other people* by entrusting them with the revelation of his prophetic promises.

But what if some were unfaithful to their divine calling? Does their unbelief weaken YHVH's faithfulness?

Absolutely not! YHVH will always be proven faithful and true to His word, while people are proven to be liars. This will fulfill what was written in the Scriptures:

Your words will always be vindicated and you will rise victorious when you are being tried by your critics!!

But what if our wrong shows how right YHVH is? Doesn't our bad serve the purpose of making YHVH look good? (Of course, I'm only speaking from a human viewpoint.) Would that infer that YHVH is unfair when He displays His anger against wrongdoing? Absolutely not! For if that were the case, how could YHVH be the righteous judge of all the earth?

So, if my lie brings into sharp contrast the brightness of YHVH's truth, and if my lie accentuates His glory, then why should I be condemned as a sinner?

Is it proper for us to sin, just so good things may come? May it never be!

Yet there are some who slander us and claim that is what we teach. They deserve to be condemned for even saying it!

Universal Sinfulness

Romans 3:9 - 12

So, are we to conclude then that we Jews are superior to all others?

Certainly not! For we have already proven that both Jews and Goyim are all under the bondage of sin. And the Scriptures agree, for it is written:

There is no one who always does what is right, no, not even one! There is no one with true spiritual insight, and there is no one who seeks after YHVH alone.

All have deliberately wandered from YHVH's ways. All have become depraved and unfit.

Kindness has disappeared from them all, not even one is good.

Romans 3:13 - 23

Their words release a stench, like the smell of death foul and filthy!

Deceitful lies roll off their tongues. The venom of a viper drips from their lips.

Bitter profanity flows from their mouths, only meant to cut and harm.

They are infatuated with violence and murder.

They release ruin and misery wherever they go.

They never experience the path of peace.

They shut their eyes to the awe-inspiring YHVH!

Now, we realize that everything the law says is addressed to those who are under its authority. This is for two reasons: So that every excuse will be silenced, with no boasting of innocence. And so that the entire world will be held accountable to YHVH's standards. For by the merit of observing the law no one earns the status of being declared righteous before YHVH, for it is the law that fully exposes and unmasks the reality of sin.

But now, independently of the law, the righteousness of YHVH is tangible and brought to light through Yeshua, the Anointed One. This is the righteousness that the Scriptures prophesied would come. It is YHVH's righteousness made visible through the faithfulness of Yeshua HaMashiach . And now all who believe in him receive that gift. For there is really no difference between us, for we all have sinned and are in need of the glory of YHVH

Adam and Chavva (Eve) were **exiled from the Garden of Adon because of sin**. They became fruitful and multiplied, as YHVH intended, but sin manifested as he took on the attribute of evil. Qayin became the a murderer when he murdered his brother Abel (Havel) who was righteous.

Tragically, Qayin did not take the opportunity YHVH gave him to repent. Murder manifested five generations later in his descendant Lamech, who also refused to repent.

Before the woman received her name she was named Isha. Adam as saying appear right after his wife was created. He gives her a name, but also mentions a connection between his name and hers: Genesis 2,:23
ויֹאמֶר, הָאָדָם, זֹאת הַפַּעַם עֶצֶם מֵעֲצָמֵי, וּבָשָׁר מִבְּשָׁרִי; לְזֹאת יִקְּרֵא

Then the man said, "This one at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh. This one shall be called Woman (isha) for from man (ish) she was taken".

Taken as been preserved and being one.

It seemed that through generations the attribute of being unrighteous and evil was the way of choice.

Evil always contributed to the attribute of violence. In the chapters of the times and ages of Noah, the earth was filled with violence (hamas – חָמֶט).

Evil always wants to take revenge instead of repentance. Satan would go to all extent to increase it. As Evil simmer like a boiling pot, somewhere some time it will explode.

Satan continued with the great attempt to become god. He even brought confusion in heaven as a third of heavens Angels were casted out.

Let us take a moment and see what Chavvah (Eve) found in the character and attribute of the serpent. When she was filled with sin and nakedness exposed. Adam was right there with her. He could have taken dominion.

Let us read Ezekiel 2811-19 (please read the full chapter) The word of YHVH came to me:

"Son of man, take up a lament concerning the king of Tyre and say to him: 'This is what the Sovereign YHVH says:

"You were the seal of perfection, full of wisdom and perfect in beauty.

You were in Eden, the garden of Adonai; every precious stone adorned you:

carnelian, chrysolite and emerald,

topaz, onyx and jasper,

lapis lazuli, turquoise and beryl.

Your settings and mountings were made of gold; on the day you were created they were prepared.

You were anointed as a guardian cherub, for so I ordained you. You were on the holy mount of YHVH; you walked

among the fiery stones. You were blameless in your ways from the day you were created till wickedness was found in you. Through your widespread trade you were filled with violence, (hamas) and you sinned.

So I drove you in disgrace from the mount of YHVH, and I expelled you, guardian cherub, from among the fiery stones. Your heart became proud on account of your beauty, and you corrupted your wisdom because of your splendor. So I threw you to the earth; I made a spectacle of you before kings.

YHVH decided to cleanse the world from that **hamas** by sending a Great Flood upon the earth that would destroy every living thing He had created.

The main artery of our existence is that we walk by faith in YHVH and never doubt in His Oracles. That our blood will keep on flowing until He says it is complete. His word is truth and is the weapon we must use in defense. When YHVH speak it will be done.

Genesis 6:13

"So YHVH said to Noach, I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence [hamas] because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth."

Hebrews 11:7

"By faith Noah, when warned about things not yet seen, in holy fear built an ark to save his family. By his faith he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness that is in keeping with faith."

Although the world was filled with injustice, cruelty and violence, YHVH found one man worth saving. Noach (Noah) was in his generation the only **ish tzadik** (righteous man).

In Hebrew, the name **Noach** means rest or consolation. It is related to the word for comfort.

His father called him Noach believing that he would bring him rest from hard labor over the ground that was cursed because of sin. (Genesis 5:29)

Because Noach was a righteous man, YHVH instructed him to build the ark to save himself, his family, and the world's animals from the coming deluge. In that way, those who followed Noach into the ark found rest from YHVH's judgment.

When his family left the ark, they entered what was essentially a new world. A new birth of earth

Though Noach likely could not even imagine a flood so severe that everything and everyone on earth would be destroyed, he obeyed YHVH. His faithfulness and obedience was the sign YHVH is Elohim Adonai Allmighty.

He labored in the sun, following through on YHVH's instructions. He did not need to wait on evidence of lighting or thunder. He believed what YHVH said is true. He knew the coming rain is just the confirmation. He truly had faith in YHVH.

Hebrews 11:7

It was Noah's great faith that led him to work obediently with Godly fear to build an ark for the saving of his family.

Noah's Ark (**Tevat Noach**) guaranteed only their physical salvation, not their spiritual destiny. We are saved by faithfulness.

When we repent for our sins, faithfully believe in YHVH, we are forgiven.

Qayin fallen short because he did not repent, instead he build a empire of (Hammas) violence.

The Hammer (violent) hit the nails (Yathed in Hebrew) "piercing," in Yeshua. Bearing all on the cross in remission of sins.

Just lastly sharing this.

A nail, (Isaiah 11:7) a stake, (Isaiah 33:20) is also a tent-peg. Tent-pegs were of large size; but some times, as was the case with those used to fasten the curtains of the tabernacle of metal.

(Exodus 27:19; 38:20) A nail is primarily a point.

We are told that David prepared iron for the nails to be used in the temple; and as the holy of holies was plated with gold, the nails for fastening the plates were probably of gold.

As this was the Holy Temple for YHVH to dwell. The nails (Yathed) made His dwelling secure.
